Consumers Energy - Furnaces

Highlands has received notification that the additional 114 furnaces are going to be replaced through a grant program from Consumers Energy. Parker Arntz anticipates starting the project in mid-December. Just like the 300 furnaces replaced earlier in the year, there is no cost to Highlands for these. We can thank Consumers Energy, Parker Arnst and Legacy for the new furnaces.

Consumer Energy - Insulation

Highlands received funds from Consumers Energy to have additional insulation blown into the attic of all 414 townhouses. This project will start on November 14th. There is no cost to Highlands for this and the approximate savings for this project is \$1,000,000. We can thank Consumers Energy, Parker Arnst and Legacy for the new insulation..

Stump Grinding Bids

Heist moved to accept bid from M. Schaefer Lane & Snow at a cost of \$6,000 to grind out 58 stumps, clean out and reseed the area. This is needed for the trees that were removed by the Board of Water and Light's wire clearance project. James seconded.

Motion Carried 4-0.

Vehicle Repair - 1999 Chevrolet

James moved to approve the phone poll to authorize the repair of this vehicle at a cost of \$5,625.68. The vote was yes 4-0. Reuben was unable to be contacted. This is the vehicle that the salt spreader is put on each winter and the side panels during Spring-Summer-Fall. Heist seconded.

Robert has been unable to find a used replacement for this truck since it requires an 8-foot bed without an extended cab. He will continue to look for a replacement, however, he feels that these repairs will give him a couple years of use with the current vehicle.

Miller Brothers Excavating

In August 2021, Highlands entered into a contract with Miller Brothers Excavating to repair five (5) backyard basins at a cost of \$10,880. These are at 1754 Georgetown, 6242 Haag, 6233 Balfour, 6206 Balfour and 1785 Georgetown. Due to Covid Pandemic they were unable to honor the contract at that time. They are now in a position to do the repairs with no increase in the bid, however, Highlands has another basin needing repairs at 6139 Haag. The cost for this is \$2,695 making the total cost of the project \$13,575.
