

If the air conditioner is not removed before November 1, you will be charged \$50.00 per air conditioning unit for every month that the unit(s) remains in the window(s).

Woodchips

Beginning mid-October, the grounds staff will begin replenishing the woodchips in the front flowerbeds. Not all flower beds will require more woodchips. Every flower bed that needs woodchips will receive woodchips, but if your flowerbed contains stones or member purchased woodchips, the flowerbed will not get woodchips.

• Turn off the water while you brush your teeth


• Have those leaks fixed! A dripping faucet or running toilet can waste a gallon or more of water a day \$\$\$

If it is verified that you are in violation of this policy, you will be will be fined \$20.00 per window or door. An attempt will be made to contact you to allow you to close the door or window. If we cannot reach you, we will send maintenance personnel to close it, and you will be charged an additional \$20.00 per door or window.
