Interior walls are of dry wall construction. Framed studs are usually 16 inches apart. Nails or screws put into a wall will hold only if they hit a stud. The Member can buy a small magnetic device (stud finder, available at most hardware stores) to help locate studs.

If a Member must nail or screw between the studs, a toggle bolt or molly should be used. When the Member moves, however, the Member must spackle, sand, and paint over a toggle bolt or molly unless they can be removed without damage to the wall.

When removing picture hooks that are fastened by adhesive cloth, first moisten the cloth then carefully pull it off to avoid harming the wall. Next, scrape off the excess glue and cloth, then sand and paint, if necessary.

Avoid using contact paper, cloth, or sticking devices on walls. All are difficult to remove, and the Member will be held responsible for any damage.
