Daylight Savings Time begins on the second Sunday in March in most areas of the US. This year, we will "spring forward" one hour on Sunday, March 9, 2025 - At 2 a.m. time will "spring" forward to become 3 a.m.

Daylight savings time is achieved by moving our clocks ahead one hour, to make better use of the longer daylight hours we enjoy during summer, so that darkness falls at a later time. It has been observed for 116 years and will last a total for 240 days - at which time we will set out clocks back one hour.

# UPCOMING INCOME REVIEW

Each year, Members are required to verify their annual household income to determine whether their total annual household income falls below the maximum income allowed without having to pay a 10% surcharge. As part of the process, if you are not paying a surcharge, you will need to provide documentation of your annual income.

If you file a 1040 income tax return you will be required to provide a copy of your 2024 income tax return. If you do not file an income tax return, you will need to provide end of the year income statements for 2024 or award letters for 2025.

Members currently paying surcharge are only required to verify their current household occupants and not required to submit any financial information.


Each member will receive a packet for the upcoming income review containing forms to be reviewed, signed and returned to the Office by the deadline.
