






2 teaspoons grated orange peel

2 cups halved seedless grapes (any color)

2 cups fresh blueberries

2 cups sliced fresh strawberries

2 cups fresh raspberries (or blackberries)

2 medium apples chopped

For dressing -

Whisk together honey, orange juice, and orange peel in a medium bowl In a large serving bowl combine grapes, blueberries, and strawberries. Gently stir in dressing. Cover and chill for 2 to 24 hours. *Before serving*, gently stir in raspberries and apples.







Outside of work, I have been married for 43 years. I have two children and two grand kids. I enjoy spending time with my grand kids, golfing, fishing, and hunting.



IMPORTANT NOTICE TRASH REMOVAL

This notice explains important changes to our trash disposal procedures, effective **Friday September 5th at 4:00 p.m**. Please read this document carefully to understand how these changes will affect you.

Highlands has been experiencing a significant increase in illegal dumping, both by non-members and by Members granting permission to friends and family to dispose of their trash in Highlands' dumpsters. Some Members mistakenly believe disposing of trash bags and large items like beds or couches in Highlands' dumpsters is free, but it's not; our monthly trash removal costs are based on the amount of trash collected each week and this expense is included in your monthly carrying charges.

To address illegal dumping by non-members and discourage large item disposal by members in the dumpster, we are implementing the following changes:

- 1. A cable will be installed across the driveway, approximately halfway up from the road.
- 2. The cable will be in place from 4:00 p.m. Friday until 7:00 a.m. Monday. During this time, trash may be taken to the dumpsters by using a walkway on the right side of the driveway.
- To dispose of large items you must contact the Office to make arrangements in advance.
 Members who do not make these arrangements will result in the Member being charged for the disposal of the large items.
- 4. No trash can be left at the cable. Any items left at the cable will result in a fine to the offending member.

If you observe individuals disposing of large amounts of trash or large items, please report it to the Office as soon as possible during normal office hours. Provide the date and time of the occurrence and the color and type of vehicle. **DO NOT confront individuals, take pictures, or otherwise draw attention to yourself.** With the information you provide, we can review camera footage to gather the necessary details to prosecute offenders.

Illegal dumping will be reported to the Lansing Police Department, and prosecution will be pursued. Offenders are subject to fines ranging from \$1,500 to \$10,000 and/or imprisonment for up to one year, depending on the amount of trash disposed.
